ORDER ADOPTING
RULE CR-104

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

The Shoshone and Arapahoe Tribal Court hereby finds that a forum is required to adjudicate and implement grants and programs relating to abuse of alcohol and drug and additions thereto via judicial supervision, supervised probations, deferred prosecution, treatment, monitoring of program participants and to promote effective interaction and use of resources among juvenile justice personnel from Tribal, State, and Federal Agencies;

And it appearing that such should be adopted by rule of Court;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, pursuant to the authority designated in Rule 37 (1), Shoshone and Arapahoe Rules of Criminal Procedure (SARCRP) and in Order to supplement Rule CR 101 b 1 (f) and Section 3-5-16 (SALOC) and to harmonize and carry out the intent of these rules and provisions, the following Rule of Court be, and the same is hereby adopted to govern all juvenile offender proceedings, in the Shoshone and Arapahoe Children's Court.

RULE OF COURT CR-104
SUBSTANCE ABUSE COURT

a) Court Established

There is hereby established a Shoshone and Arapahoe Juvenile Substance Abuse Court to adjudicate cases involving substance abuse program participants in the Shoshone and Arapahoe Children's Court.

b) **Effective Date**

The provisions of this rule shall be effective immediately upon the date of the Order adopting this rule.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Court Administrator shall make this Order and this rule available for public inspection and copying at no charge.
