ORDER ADOPTING RULE CR-105

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

The Shoshone and Arapaho Tribal Court finds that a procedure is necessary to process defendants with severe alcohol problems directly into inpatient treatment following an evaluation and based upon the following criteria:

- 1) A request by immediate family or by a physician from I.H.S.; and
- 2) Conviction of at least two (2) alcohol-related offenses in any court within the past thirty (30) days.

THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED, and DECREED that pursuant to the authority designated in Rule 37(1) Rules of Criminal Procedure, Shoshone and Arapaho Law and Order Code (SALOC) and Sections 7-1-3(2) and (5) (SALOC) and to carry out the intent of those provisions, the following Rule of Court be, and the same is hereby, adopted to govern all dispositions that meet the above criteria.

**RULE OF COURT NO. CR-105
COURT ORDERED TREATMENT**

- 1) Initiation Procedure - written request to the Tribal Prosecutor:
 - a. By an immediate family member such as spouse, parent(s), children, etc.;
 - b. By an I.H.S. physician; or
 - c. Current guardian.
- 2) Criteria
 - a. Defendant must have been convicted of at least two (2) alcohol-related offenses in the past thirty (30) days in any court; and
 - b. Defendant must be presently charged with and convicted of an alcohol-related offense in this court.
